Amen.




The Collect for Purity

All: Praise be to Thee, O Christ




The Creed

Hear also what Saint Paul saith.


This is a true saying, and worthy of all men to be received,

Priest: Almighty God, our heavenly Father,

to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption;
who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full,
perfect and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction,
for the sins of the whole world;
and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue,
a perpetual memory of that his precious death,
until his coming again;
Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee;
and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine,
according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution,
in remembrance of his death and passion,
may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood;
who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread;
and, when he had given thanks, he brake it,
and gave it to his disciples, saying,
Take, eat, this is my Body which is given for you:
Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the Cup;
and, when he had given thanks,
he gave it to them,
saying Drink ye all of this;
for this is my Blood of the New Testament,
which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins:
Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.
Amen.

Priest: The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ,
which was given for thee,
preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life:
Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for thee,
and feed on him in thy heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ,
which was shed for thee,
preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life:
Drink this in remembrance that Christ's Blood was shed for thee,
and be thankful.

heavenly King, God the Father Almighty.**


**O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesu Christ;
